

Ingrifone

The ingrifone is a very debated beast, because some authors think that it is not real, but only a mythological creature, like the patchworked grifone of the mesopotamic legend, that has the body of the lion and the mus of aqueela.

However, some very coragious zoologists, that work every day in the wild, swear that they have seen the ingrifone in Sardinia. This silvicol animal is endemic of a very small area near Villa Certosa and is characterized by the body very similar to the grifone (the real grifone, not the mythological) and the head very similar to that of a famous italian politician, but a little more spelachiated because not yet operated, so he usually wears a bandana.
